

You walk on custard and learn how to carve a spoon in the **Hands on Centre**.

In the **Arts Centre** you learn a craft from another country and make things to take back to your village.

Make a funny video about a lost welly in the **Media Centre** to show in the news. This involves going round and filming people doing silly things and then editing the video back at the media centre.

You go to the **Heritage Centre** and spend the afternoon in a 1925 camp, you see how Woodcrafters would have camped 100 years ago, you try some food and look at the different equipment they used.

You hear from people from different countries how racism has affected their lives and talk about how it has changed yours in the **Anti-Racism and Fascism Centre**.

You work out your carbon footprint and watch a film about refugees in a bike powered cinema as part of the **Environment & Migration Centre**.

You make new friends and talk in the **café**, maybe there is a quiz, maybe there is a band playing.

At the **Rainbow Centre** you create colourful costumes for a Pride march the next day.

You take part in a mock trial at the **Feminism Centre** where a suffragette is being tried for breaking the glass in a shop window. Your role is to sit on the jury and debate whether she is guilty of vandalism. Other children there play the lawyers and the witnesses. You all get some time to get into character.

You go to **MESTUP** and they help you sort out an argument you were having with your friend.

You go to the **Conflict, Peace and Cooperation Centre** and make props and act out the song we've got axes and film it for the news.
